



Science Summit at the 77 United Nation General Assembly (SSUNGA77) Date: 22 and 28 September 2022; Time: 1630 hrs to 1900 hrs (IST)

<u>Brief Report</u>

Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR), India organized a two-day event during the Science Summit at 77 United Nations General Assembly, 2022 (SSUNGA77) entitled "CSIR, India: An Innovation Hub for Global Sustainable Development" on September 22 & September 28, 2022 with an aim to showcase CSIR's contributions to Science and Technology and its efforts towards Global Sustainable Development.

Through S&T interventions in a wide spectrum of S&T fields (from oceanography, geophysics, chemicals, drugs, genomics, biotechnology and nanotechnology to mining, aeronautics, instrumentation, environmental engineering and information technology), CSIR has been contributing to the industrial, societal and economic growth of India, for eight decades now. It has helped the country overcome many challenges and crisis. Also, CSIR has been immensely contributing to the UN Sustainable Development Goals. The Session "CSIR, India: An Innovation Hub for Global Sustainable Development" briefly showcased S&T interventions and solutions of CSIR that contribute to the UN SDGs.

The two-day event (virtual mode) encompassed 5 sessions with 22 eminent speakers/ experts and a panel discussion. During inaugural session on September 22, 2022, Dr N. Kalaiselvi, Director General, CSIR and Secretary, Department of Scientific and Industrial Research, Government of India gave an overview of CSIR and invited collaborations. It was followed by scientific sessions focused on Food, nutrition and botanical innovations (No poverty, Zero hunger - SDG 1, 2); Affordable Healthcare (SDG 3); and Water & life below water (SDG 6, 13, 14).
