Sub: Delay in filing of SLP/Civil Appeals etc. - SOP/Timelines-

Sir,

Secretary Department of Legal Affairs Ministry of Law and Justice, vide their DO Letter No. J-12012/2/2023-Judicial dated 02/02/2023 (copy enclosed) have observed that there is a number of occasion in which SLPs, Appeals, Reply/Counter Affidavit etc. are not filed in the court within the stipulated period resulting in adverse orders by the courts. While referring to the instructions issued in this regard from time to time, they have desired that in order to avoid delay in Central Government litigation, the timeline as given in the above said DO should be adhered to.

The Competent Authority, CSIR has accepted the instructions/timeline as mentioned in the DO letter (mutatis-mutandis) and accordingly approved that in order to avoid delay in litigation where limitation period is 90 days, following timeline may be adhered to:-

It has been noticed by various field offices of Ministry of Law & Justice and by Law Officers / Panel Counsel who appear on behalf of Union of India before various courts / tribunals that there are a number of occasions in which SLPs, Appeals, the reply / counter-affidavits etc. are not filed in the court within the stipulated period resulting in adverse orders by the courts.

2. This Department has been issuing instructions in this regard from time to time. Two. such instructions were issued in the year 2015 & 2016 vide DO letter No. 35(1)/2015-Judl. 27th August, 2015 and No. J-12/2/2016-Judl. dated 9th June, 2016. Besides, Cabinet Secretariat has also issued detailed guidelines in this regard vide DO letter No. 1/50/3/2016-Cab. dated 16th June, 2016 and No. 403/1/5/2016-CA.V dated 25th November, 2016. All these instructions are available on website of this Department i.e. www.legalaffairs.gov.in under tab 'Judicial Section' in the link 'Circulars pertaining to litigation'. Despite the instructions issued as above, incidents of delay in filing SLPs, Appeals, reply/counter-affidavits etc. occur.

3. In order to avoid delay in Central Government litigation, where limitation period is 90 days, following timeline may be adhered to: -

4.	Approval of the draft by the concerned Ministry / Departments and providing necessary documents	5 days	5 days
5.	Preparing paper book and filing	10 days	10 days

4. In other matters, like filing statutory appeals, review and other affidavits, where limitation period is 60 days or 30 days or any specified time given by the court, the above time line may be reduced correspondingly.
